

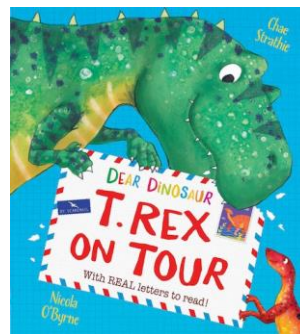

### Maths

#### Place Value within 10

- I can sort and count objects.
