### English



### Humanities

We will focus on geography this half term and our topic will be 'Rivers.' We will be locating the world's significant rivers and investigating why there are not rivers in every continent. After studying the main features of a river, how rivers are used and the causes and impacts of floods, we will conduct a fieldwork investigation during a visit to the River Yar. Here we will look at the natural and man-made features along the route and create a detailed map using OS symbols and a key.
